

An amazing statistic from treasurer Donald Stone was his calculation on our volunteer power worth. We take in generous donations, and grants also keep our financial outlook bright, but factoring the 4,452 volunteer hours at \$20 an hour equals the monetary equivalent of \$89,040 donated.

A Dementia Friends Info Session was presented by Nancy Spittle on June 13 at the Wendell Senior Center.

The workshop offered basic awareness of normal aging vs dementia, tips on communication with folks having language and memory difficulties and five key messages that lead to improved quality of life for those affected. As this is an important concern for VN, stay tuned for another session in the near future.

Nancy Spittle also presented about this topic at the Annual meeting with suggestions of how we can get our legislators to help with these

challenges.

We can encourage our towns to adopt this awareness, and we can all learn how to reach out to other community resources.
