What is a Dementia Friend?

Over 120.000 Massachusetts residents are living with dementia, and numbers will be growing as our communities age. Unfortunately, lack of information, fear and isolation often impact people affected and their caregivers in our communities. A Dementia Friendly community is one that is safe, respectful and inclusive of those affected, in the same way that we include fellow citizens of different ages and abilities.

This interactive workshop will present basic information about dementia, what its effects are and how it differs from normal aging, some skills to help communication with those with dementia, and some ways to become more comfortable with including folks with dementia in our social life. We can affirm that it is possible to have a good quality of life with dementia, and that people with dementia are a valuable part of our communities. Join us!

Village Neighbors FAQ's (Frequently Asked Questions)

Why should I join Village Neighbors? I already have neighbors...

Community is based on friends and neighbors helping each other out, but what about elders in the backwoods who may not be able to reach a friend when need arises? Village Neighbors is just a phone call away. We will connect the member in need of services with one of our 70+ vetted volunteers who are interested in providing the needed service. New friends are made and assistance is always available.

Why does Village Neighbors cost \$75? Where does the money go...

Village Neighbors maintains a virtual phone line, we don't have a physical office. The VN phone number is directed through a virtual phone system, our email system and our Club Express data base. Although these systems are manned by volunteers, there is an annual fee to maintain them all and to keep the systems running. We carry insurance to protect our members and volunteers in case of accidents. Mailing costs, community outreach and providing free activities can also be expensive. There is a fee waver for people who are on fixed income and cannot afford the annual membership.

Why do we have to be over 60 to receive benefits?

Village Neighbors is based on the Village-to-Village model, a growing national movement for helping seniors Age-in-Place, remain in their homes and retain their quality of life. We are incorporated under this model. Our four town community - Leverett, New Salem, Shutesbury and Wendell - has people of all ages that would benefit from community assistance, but we are limited to working with elders right now. Please consider volunteering, joining a committee or the VN Board, to help us organize and grow in a way that best suits our towns.

What benefits does Village Neighbors offer that are different from other local organizations?

1) Although some of our Councils on Aging offer Med rides, Village Neighbors will drive you anywhere you

need to go - take you and your pet to the vet, take you shopping, to events, visits, activities, etc.

- 2) We are available to help with small chores or fixits, stacking wood, shoveling, setting up electronic devices in your home, and many other small chores that become difficult as we age.
- 3) We offer Dementia Friendly classes to assist individuals in our community who provide care for family and friends suffering from Dementia and Alzheimer's.
- 4) We can offer referrals to other organizations that may have specific services and assistance you may need.
- 5) We are developing activities based on member and volunteer interests that will offer more opportunities for elders to be actively engaged within in the community.
- 6) We are also developing a vetted local vendor list for larger repairs and services that may not be available through our volunteers.

How do I become a Volunteer?

Becoming a Volunteer is easy. Volunteers are all ages and pay no fee. All volunteers put in as much or as little time as they want. You will be asked to attend a Volunteer Orientation where you can specify what services you are interested in providing – driving, companionship, helping hands, committee work, etc.; and any community building activities you would like to develop or participate in. Being a Village Neighbors Volunteer brings with it the opportunity to add your vision to the community where we live, raise our families and hope to grow old. We are growing, and with your help and input, we can adapt our organization to what is needed in our specific hill-town community. Many of our members are also volunteers who have opted to pay the fee, even if they are not in need of services yet, in order to support this co-created vision of our community's future.
